This is the night especially for those veterans. Broward County schools, who have so generously supported Honor Flight, are sponsoring this special night. Veterans and families will have dinner and special entertainment. Jim Naskrent will be premiering the documentary "Virtual Honor Flight -- A Mission of Thanks." There will be Mail Call and other special surprises. The goal is to simulate the entire Honor Flight experience to those veterans who otherwise will not be able to go on one. WORLD WAR II-VIETNAM VETERANS FLIGHT: This unique flight is scheduled on Eastern Airlines on April 2, probably out of Miami but Fort Lauderdale is a possibility. We will be taking 75 World War II veterans with 75 Vietnam War veterans serving as "elite guardians." The normal guardian fee is being waived for these Vietnam era "elite guardians." This is believed to be the first Honor Flight ever with the bonding of these two generations. This is a special opportunity for Vietnam era veterans and Chairman Rick Asper stressed that flying World War II veterans will remain the priority for Honor Flight South Florida.
